MEDINA MUNICIPAL COURT 2007 ANNUAL REPORT

The following is the yearly report of operations for the Medina Municipal Court as required by Ohio Revised Code Sec. 1901.14.

The Court received new filings of 17,393 cases and terminated 16,713 cases.

These cases generated \$4,919,329.09 of disbursements, which include bond and civil judgments.

PROBATION DEPARTMENT

Marirose Power, Chief Probation Officer

The probation department employs three full-time general supervision probation officers, a part-time officer supervising a specialized caseload of drug offenders and select intensive supervision cases, a full-time intensive supervision probation officer (ISP), a full-time chief probation officer, and three part-time clerical staff. State of Ohio grant funds cover the salary and benefits of the full-time ISP officer, one part-time secretary and a portion of the part-time intensive supervision officer.

The department completed 1,345 pre-sentence investigations, 77 sealing of records investigations and reviewed over 300 traffic cases prior to sentencing.

Of the 669 new offenders placed on probation 58% were convicted of an O.V.I. offense, 10% of underage alcohol offenses, 8% of drug offenses, 6% of offenses of violence, and 3% of a theft offense. The remaining 15% represents various other criminal and traffic offenses.

The department conducted nearly 3,500 reporting appointments and required 1,696 drug tests. 56 offenders served terms of electronically monitored house arrest. 119 individuals were charged with violating conditions of probation.

ALCOHOL TREATMENT FUNDS AND JAIL COSTS

The Court collected \$20,194.26 in fines for the Indigent Drivers Alcohol Treatment Act (IDATA) in 2007. These fines can be used to pay for treatment of indigent defendants. The Court also collected \$38,127.50 for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol jail costs, which was paid to the Medina County Auditor. The Court disbursed to townships, cities, Medina County and the State of Ohio a total of \$16,475.00 from fines collected under the Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol Act. These funds may be used by the arresting agencies for equipment, training, and enforcement of driving under the influence of alcohol laws.

BAILIFF'S OFFICE

Carl Meding, Bailiff

The Bailiff's Office employs one Bailiff, and three full-time and one part-time Deputy Bailiffs. Bailiffs are responsible for courtroom and building security, attending to the Court's electronic recording system, and overseeing the activities of all individuals present in the building. The Bailiff's Office oversees four part-time security personnel who operate the Court's metal detector and screen all persons entering the building.

The part-time Deputy Bailiff is responsible for the service of subpoenas and other court papers throughout the Court's jurisdiction, including executing evictions and Court ordered sales of property. In 2007, the Bailiff's office supervised 139 evictions, a 24% increase over 2006. (See Table #1)

The Bailiff's Office maintains and operates the Court's Law Enforcement Automated Data System (LEADS) and recently received its second straight excellent rating during the 2007 biennial state audit.

The Bailiff's Office actively pursues people who have failed to appear at Court or have otherwise ignored Court orders. During 2007, the Court's Bailiff Office physically arrested 95 defendants and cleared a total of 556 warrants by all means. (See Table #2) The enforcement of warrants for fines and costs resulted in payments of \$108,005.65. This warrant activity also includes the publication and distribution of the Court's Most Wanted Posters. This allows the community to assist the Court in resolving outstanding warrants.

A unique program administered by the Bailiff's Office is the entry of information on certain convicted defendants into the Federal National Crime Information Center's (NCIC) Supervised Release File. This file helps track those convicted defendants who have been placed on probation. This program began in April 2006 and currently remains the only program authorized at the municipal court level in Ohio to independently enter these defendants in NCIC. At the end of 2007, this Court maintained 493 entries into NCIC. Such data entry allows the Court, and its Probation Department, to better monitor those defendants in their charge for the greater good of the community.

In 2007, the Court recorded 101 contacts with other law enforcement agencies by these entered defendants. These contacts include relatively minor traffic citations, and involvement in serious incidents such as OVI, felony drug charges, felonious assault (with firearm), and gross sexual imposition. Twelve defendants were found to have left the state without permission in violation of probation conditions. Nine contacts came as a result of probationers attempting to leave the country, as reported to the Court by the United States Border Patrol.

COMPUTER DEVELOPMENTS

Rich Armstrong, Management Information Specialist

The court employs a Management Information Specialist to coordinate all technology applications. The current equipment in place consists of 40 printers and 45 PCs. A set of Dell 2900 servers hold the court records, and two IBM X Series servers handle the *Online Court Access* and protect the system as a firewall. The installed value of computers and software is approximately \$400,000, none of which came from the City of Medina general fund.

The Court is upgrading to a new computer system and software from Civica Systems of Englewood, OH. The upgrade will take approximately two years to complete. New software was installed for the criminal/traffic division, probation, and document scanning. The civil division will convert to the new operating system in 2008. Court records are backed up daily to a tape drive and stored offsite.

The probation department continued scanning historical records into the imaging database during 2007. This imaging database allows documents to be stored in digital format and printed on demand. This increases the efficiency of the department, prevents misplaced files, saves probation officers time in retrieving files, and reduces the space required to store files.

The Court's website was upgraded in 2007. A link was added to allow jurors to confirm the date and time of the trial for which they were selected.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETING SERVICES

The Court continues to see an increase in the number of criminal and traffic cases involving defendants who do not speak English and require assistance in their native language to understand the court proceedings. The Court contracted with Language Line Services of Monterey, California to provide language translation for short court proceedings (approximately 5 to 10 minutes in length) and with Monarca Language Services, a Medina business, for all other translation services.
