MEDINA MUNICIPAL COURT 2008 ANNUAL REPORT

The following is the yearly report of operations for the Medina Municipal Court as required by Ohio Revised Code Sec. 1901.14.

The Court received new filings of 18,012 cases and terminated 17,482 cases.

These cases generated \$5,023,613.21 of disbursements, which include bond and civil judgments.

PROBATION DEPARTMENT

Marirose Power, Chief Probation Officer

The probation department employs three full-time general supervision probation officers, a part-time officer supervising a specialized caseload of drug offenders, a full-time intensive supervision probation officer (ISP), a full-time chief probation officer and three part-time clerical staff. State of Ohio grant funds cover the salary and benefits of the full-time ISP officer and one member of the clerical staff. The ISP program serves both Medina and Wadsworth Municipal Courts.

The department completed 1,468 pre-sentence investigations, 65 sealing of record investigations, and reviewed over 900 traffic cases prior to sentencing. Of the 584 new offenders placed on probation, 56% were convicted of an O.V.I. offense, 11% of underage alcohol offenses, 9% of drug offenses, 5% for theft offenses and 4% for offenses of violence (including domestic violence). The remaining 15% represents various other criminal and traffic offenses.

The department conducted over 3,100 reporting appointments and required nearly 1,600 drug tests. Forty-one offenders served terms of electronically-monitored house arrest. Eighty-six individuals were charged with violating conditions of probation.

ALCOHOL TREATMENT FUNDS AND JAIL COSTS

The Court collected \$20,773.50 in fines for the Indigent Drivers Alcohol Treatment Act (IDATA) in 2008. These fines can be used to pay for treatment of indigent defendants. The Court also collected \$37,214.34 for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol jail costs, which was paid to the Medina County Auditor. The Court disbursed to townships, cities, Medina County and the State of Ohio a total of \$11,554.14 from fines collected under the Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol Act. These funds may be used by the arresting agencies for equipment, training, and enforcement of driving under the influence of alcohol laws.

BAILIFF'S OFFICE

The Bailiff's Office employs one Bailiff and four full-time Deputy Bailiffs. Bailiffs are responsible for courtroom and building security, attending to the Court's electronic recording system, and overseeing the activities of all individuals present in the building and on the grounds. The Bailiff's Office supervises seven part-time security personnel who operate the Court's metal detector and screen all persons entering the building.

In 2008, the Bailiff's office supervised 175 evictions, including 43 voluntary move-outs after Court ordered writs were issued. This is a 20.5% increase over 2007. (See Table #1)

The Bailiff's Office maintains and operates the Court's Law Enforcement Automated Data System (LEADS) and recently received its third straight excellent rating during the 2008 audit cycle.

The Bailiff's Office actively pursues people who have failed to appear at Court or have otherwise ignored Court orders. During 2008, the Court's bailiffs physically arrested 91 defendants and cleared a total of 663 warrants by all means. (See Table #2) The enforcement of warrants for fines and costs resulted in payments of \$131,040.88. This warrant activity also includes the publication and distribution of the Court's Most Wanted Posters. This allows the community to assist the Court in resolving outstanding warrants. Table #3 details warrants on hand at the end of 2008.

A unique program administered by the Bailiff's Office is the entry of information on certain convicted defendants into the Federal National Crime Information Center's (NCIC) Supervised Release File. This file tracks convicted defendants who are placed on probation. The program began in April 2006. It is the only program authorized at the municipal court level in Ohio to independently enter these probationers in NCIC. At the end of 2008, the Court maintained 496 entries in NCIC.

In 2008, this program received 172 contacts from other law enforcement agencies dealing with these probationers. These contacts include minor traffic citations and more serious matters such as drug trafficking, kidnapping and domestic violence. Ten defendants were found to have left the state without permission in violation of probation conditions. A further 14 contacts came as a result of probationers leaving the country, as reported to the Court by Homeland Security agencies.

COMPUTER DEVELOPMENTS

Rich Armstrong, Management Information Specialist

The Court employs a Management Information Specialist to coordinate all technology applications. The current equipment in place consists of 41 printers and 46 pc/s. A set of Dell 2900 servers hold the court records, while two IBM X Series servers handle the online Court Access and protect the system as a firewall. The Court initiated a conversion from Office 2000 to Office 2007 software that will continue through 2009. The Norton Antivirus was updated to Symantec Endpoint for more thorough protection of the network. The installed value of computers and software is approximately \$450,000 of which zero dollars came from the City of Medina General Fund.

The Court transition to the new computer system and software from Civica Systems of Englewood, Ohio is continuing with the Civil application remaining to be installed. The upgrade entailed changing from the outdated character based system to the new Windows Client Server programming. The upgrade will take approximately two years to complete. New software was installed for the Criminal/Traffic Division, Probation and scanning. Civil moved to the new operating system and will convert to Client Server in 2009. The upgrade also required installing two Dell 2900 servers running Windows 2003 Servers and the SQL database. The Court records are backed up daily to an IBM Ultrium tape drive and stored offsite.

The clerical department received upgrades to their computers with new Dell Optiplex systems. This process will continue into 2009. The existing HP printers are being converted to copy/scan devices to enhance efficiency. These are being connected to the new scanning system that was installed in 2007 as the computers were updated. A new Fujitsu scanner was installed to replace an older scanner.

The Probation Department continued scanning historical records into the imaging database during 2008. This imaging database allows documents to be stored in digital format and printed on demand. This increases the efficiency of the department, prevents misplaced files, saves probation officer time in retrieving the files, and reduces the space required for storing the files. In addition, the probation computers were updated to Dell Optiplex systems. The existing HP printers were updated to allow on-demand scanning of current records. This is scheduled to begin January 1, 2009.

The Court website switched to a different provider this year as the previous provider terminated service in the Medina area. The website is now hosted by Blue Domino and continues to be maintained by Uplink/MSS of Medina and Civica/CMI of Englewood. The Court added schedule lookups and an emergency notification module to the website this year. This is part of the ongoing effort to make the website easy to use and useful to our clients.

The IT specialist attended various meetings throughout the year concerning the new laws enacted by the Ohio Legislature. The software vendor held numerous design meetings in preparation for upgrading the existing Court software. The Online Court lookup system received updates from the software vendor affecting security and display elements.
