The following is the yearly report of operations for the Medina Municipal Court as required by Ohio Revised Code Sec. 1901.14.

The Court received new filings of 11,771 cases and terminated 11,780 cases.

These cases generated \$4,079,227.38 of disbursements, which include bond and civil judgments.


























#### PROBATION DEPARTMENT

Marirose Power, Chief Probation Officer

The probation department employs three full-time general supervision/presentence investigation officers, a part-time officer, a full-time intensive supervision probation officer, a full-time chief probation officer, and three part-time clerical staff. A grant from the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction funds the position of the intensive supervision officer and one of the clerical staff. The grant funded program serves both the Medina and Wadsworth Municipal Courts.

The department completed presentence investigations in 917 cases and 175 sealing-ofrecords investigations. Additionally, 280 traffic cases were reviewed and prepared for sentencing and 280 victim impact statements were processed.

Four hundred three offenders were placed on probation. Of these, 63% were convicted of an OVI or closely related offense, 6% were convicted of domestic violence or threatening domestic violence (a reduced charge that originated as domestic violence), 6% were convicted of theft or property crimes, 3% committed assault (an act of violence), 3% had aggravated menacing/menacing charges and another 3% were convicted of underage alcohol charges. Protection order violators totaled 2%. The remaining 14% had a broad range of offenses such as telecommunications harassment, falsification, possessing drug abuse instruments and disorderly conduct.

Reporting appointments for the year totaled 2,542 and 1,255 drug tests were completed. The probation department also supervised persons ordered to bond reporting and electronically monitored house arrest and/or transdermal alcohol monitoring. All intervention in lieu of conviction candidates were monitored by probation officers, as were 38 individuals assigned to complete over 1,800 hours of community service. Seventy-two individuals were formally charged with violating conditions of probation.

#### **ALCOHOL TREATMENT FUNDS AND JAIL COSTS**

The Court collected \$28,033.30 for the Indigent Drivers Alcohol Treatment Act (IDATA) in 2016. These funds can be used to pay for treatment of indigent defendants. The Court collected \$26,038.50 for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol jail costs, which was paid to the Medina County Auditor. The Court disbursed to townships, cities, Medina County and the State of Ohio a total of \$10,848.50 from funds collected under the Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol Act. These funds may be used by the arresting agencies for equipment, training, and enforcement of driving under the influence of alcohol laws.

#### **BAILIFF'S OFFICE**

Carl Meding, Bailiff

Current staffing of the Court's Bailiff's office consists of the Bailiff, four full-time and two part-time Deputy Bailiffs (who work as security officers manning the Court's metal detector at the Court's public entrance). Bailiffs remain responsible for Courtroom and building security, attending to the Court's electronic recording system, as well as overseeing the activities of all people using the Court and its facilities. The bailiff also supervises six additional part-time security guards who operate the Court's metal detector.

One Deputy Bailiff is responsible for the service of subpoenas and other Court papers throughout the Court's jurisdiction. This includes executing evictions and Court ordered sales of property. In 2016 the Bailiff's Office scheduled and executed 155 Writs of Restitution (eviction orders), conducted one Property Attachment, and one Replevin Action per Court order.

The Bailiff's office maintains and operates the Court's Law Enforcement Automated Data System (LEADS) terminal. The Court once again passed the triennial performed by LEADS, and remains in compliance with all LEADS and NCIC regulations. Of note, the LEADS auditor specifically complimented the Court for zero errors noted when conducting criminal history background checks (which are routinely performed by the Court's bailiffs and probation officers).

The Bailiff's office continues to actively pursue defendants who have failed to appear at the Court, or have otherwise ignored Court orders. During 2016 the Court's bailiffs physically arrested 49 defendants, and cleared a total of 265 warrants.

The Bailiff's office administers the Court's program of entering the Court's probationers into the National Crime Information Center's (NCIC) Supervised Release File. These entries allow law enforcement agencies across the nation (as well as Canada and Mexico) to identify people they have come into contact with who are on probation to this Court. These agencies may then contact the Court's probation staff for additional information as necessary (e.g. individuals being screened for a firearms purchase or being screened by ICE). This allows the Court's Probation Department to better monitor those defendants on probation. At the end of 2016 the Court listed 419 probationers in the Supervised Release File. During 2016 the Court recorded 124 contacts with various law enforcement agencies dealing with the Court's probationers.

#### **COMPUTER DEVELOPMENTS**

Rich Armstrong, Management Information Specialist

The Court employs a Management Information Specialist to coordinate all technology applications. The current equipment in place consists of 43 printers, 3 printer/copier/fax systems, 53 desktop and 5 laptop PC's. Two Dell Power Edge VRTX Servers handle the case management system, document storage and online Court access. A Meraki firewall appliance was installed to comply with requirements from the Ohio LEADS organization. The Antivirus protection was upgraded on all systems.

The Court works with Technology Engineering Group in cooperation with the City of Medina to improve hardware and software programs. This year, extensive server software upgrades were installed to coincide with the E-Ticket installation.

The case management system now is integrated with the Ohio State Patrol E-ticketing system. This allows the tickets to be automatically uploaded from patrol vehicles to our system. This reduces the data entry time and increases the accuracy of information entered. This system can be expanded to other law enforcement departments to share the system, if they desire.

Court records are backed up continually to the Barracuda Cloud system which is maintained off site. The Court data contains records back to 1980. The audio is recorded in both Courtrooms by software from FTR systems and stored on multiple computers. Backups are made for each Courtroom and stored offsite and on multiple pc's within the building allowing quick recovery for Court staff, attorneys and clients

Two LEADS computer systems are used by the Court allowing timely lookup of data for the Court processing as well as reducing the workload for the Medina Police Department. The LEADS systems were upgraded to the newest release allowing much faster access to the information.

The website is hosted by Blue Domino. The website allows lookups based on case scheduling for both Criminal and Traffic as well as Civil cases.

#### **CONTINUING EDUCATION**

All Judicial seminars are through the Judicial College of the Supreme Court of Ohio unless otherwise noted.

#### FOREIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETING SERVICES

The Court maintains interpreting services for defendants who do not speak English and require assistance in their native language to understand Court proceedings. The Supreme Court of Ohio contracts with Language Line Services of Monterey, California and offers their services to Ohio Courts to provide language translation for short Court proceedings (approximately 5 to 10 minutes in length). Monarca Language Services, a Medina business, is used by the Court for other translation services.
